This level C nonfiction book is written in a riddle format using a consistent pattern. It is easily adapted to students inventing and writing their own riddles. It is especially useful in the science and language arts curriculum areas.

## ***Suggested Ideas and Activities:***

- Enjoy a group nature walk and observe animals and their homes
- Discuss why animals need different homes
- Investigate and talk about the characteristics and functions of common materials used for homes
- Sort and classify animals and their homes
- Graph the different types of homes students live in
- Investigate homes in nature and how to protect them
- Create a class riddle book using this simple pattern
- Play a concentration game using character and matching home
- Investigate homes (habitats) in nature and discuss how to protect them
- Enjoy other books on animals, homes, or riddles
